# 4C Strategies by 3/4N

3/4N recently completed a text talk to predict what a book titled 'Sunday Chutney' by Aaron Blabey was about. Text Talk requires students to collectively have a written conversation. Each member of the group has a different coloured writing tool so that their ideas can be tracked on paper. During this activity, students do not orally talk to each other although they observe normal verbal communication rules where turns are taken and no one beings writing until the previous person has finished. This learning activity requires students to work on teamwork and focus which are essential intrapersonal and interpersonal skills.


## **Community PBL**
