


Writing Stars from 3/4H

NAPLAN Results

NAPLAN results provide information to teachers and parents on what students know and can do. It is important to remember that NA-PLAN is a point in time diagnostic test. As noted on the student reports, parents and carers should take particular care in considering 2019 results if their child experienced disruptions in taking the tests due to connectivity issues. Our school did suffer connectivity issues and these were reported after each test sitting.

Year 7 Selective High School Placement in 2021

The application website for Year 7 entry into a selective High School in 2021 opens on 8th October. Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials. Parents of students enrolled in NSW government and non-government schools, home schools, interstate and overseas schools can apply. Parents of Aboriginal students are encouraged to apply for selective high school placement. Parents who would like their child to attend a selective high school must apply online at:

education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7

The application website closes at 10pm, 11 November 2019. The selective placement test for students who apply will take place 12 March, 2020 with notification of successful candidates to occur on 4 July, 2020. More information is available at the school office for interested families.

The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application

Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance Years 3-6 (Primarv)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking. Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.

If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term. ů

Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

Step 2

The school endorses your application. Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.

A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves




Better together

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during abach beitgen and the school of the sc school holidays.

Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- Concession fares across the Opal network Half-price travel after eight paid journeys
- each week* \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.


