### **Attendance**

#### **NAPLAN Online**

This year our Year 3 and 5 students will again sit the NA-PLAN assessments online. NAPLAN online provides better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information. The assessment will run through a real-time internet connection. NAPLAN online features 'tailored testing' which gives students questions that are more suited to their ability – resulting in better assessment and more precise results. The testing window for our students to complete NAPLAN online is between Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> and Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> May. Year 5 will also complete the writing assessment online, however, Year 3 students will complete this on paper. Writing will be the first assessment to be completed, as it needs to be completed in the first two days of the testing window.

### **Clean Up Australia Day**

Last Friday our students participated in Clean Up Australia Day. I have to say this was much needed as our school had a large amount of rubbish that was gathering under a number of plants and gardens. A huge thank you to Mrs Winters for organising this event for our school it was a worthwhile project.

It would be impossible to go outside of our galaxy because it is so colossal.


